Last month, at the end of March, he was trailing last year's winner, George Honeyman by some distance. George was leading on 175 votes and Jacob was, it seemed, a distant third on 119 votes. However it all changed with members allowed to vote twice, their choice of PoM for April and then again, after the final fixture against Forest, the May PoM.

For the April PoM it was the mercurial KLP who led the way on 44 votes with Jacob in 2nd on 35 but George Honeyman with 26 votes continued with what seemed like an unassailable lead into the final vote.

Then it all happened, George, with 14 votes, was still the 2nd highest vote winner but Jacob took the

resounding majority of votes for our closing match, earning 66 votes from the members.

Born in 2000 he first joined the Tiger's Academy as an 8-year-old and progressed steadily through the following years.

2018-19 Jacob captains the Under '18's.
2019 he signs his first professional contract.
2019-20 he is sent on loan to Cheltenham Town in
League 2 and makes 35 appearances and helps the
club to the League 2 Play-offs.

2020-21 back with the Tigers he settles into the 1st team and makes 41 appearances in our Championship-winning season.

2021-22 to show he was no one-season wonder he was an ever-present member of the 1st team back in the Championship – never missing a single minute across 48 fixtures.

The only disappointment is that despite many good attempts he has still to score his first senior goal!

He's 'one of our own', not just because he was born in Cottingham, but because his dad is none other than MARK GREAVES who played for the Tigers from 1996-2002, notching up 177 appearances.
