#### **NOVEMBER MEMORABILIA ARTICLE**

In a couple of weeks, we shall have a rest from watching the Tigers as the Championship takes a break whilst the World Cup is played. All our football will be via the TV. There may, of course, be 2 or 3 City players involved as we now have an influx of overseas players. Unfortunately, no England players from City will be in the England team, although former players Harry Maguire & Jarrod Bowen may have a chance of being selected. As one reflects on this it is sad to report that only one player whilst playing for the Tigers has represented England. That was way back on 19 March 1906. That honour goes to Gordon Wright (32) who played against Wales all those years ago. Unfortunately, he only played that one game.

However, several players have represented the 3 Lions before and after they played for the Tigers. I will jog your memories with brief details of the number of appearances for City and the number of caps they won. I bet there are a few players you had forgotten about so I hope you enjoy the read. As in the previous 2 articles, the number after the player's name is the Heritage Number allocated by the oncloudseven website that details the full biographies of each player. I urge you to visit this website to learn more about all players who have represented the Tigers in their 118 years' history.

Like Gordon Wright, Russell Wainscoat (245) only made one appearance for England. That was against Scotland in 1929. Russell later joined City

from Leeds United and helped the Tigers to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Division North title in 1933. Also making only one appearance was Brian Marwood (577), who started at City as an apprentice and made 191 appearances scoring 53 goals. Brian moved to Sheffield Wednesday for £115.000 and later played for Arsenal. His one appearance for England was in November 1986 against Saudi Arabia in Riyadh. Also with one cap is Frazer Campbell (903), well remembered for Wembley 2008 and his 114 appearances and 33 goals over two stints in Hull. Frazer won his cap against Holland in 2012. One player I had forgotten about is Anthony Gardner (908) who signed for the Tigers in their first season in the Premier league. Anthony suffered a string of injuries and only played 35 times in over 2 years. Whilst at Spurs he won one cap in March 2004, playing against Sweden. Lastly, with one cap is Ryan Mason (1018) who joined City in 2016 for a record fee of £13M. Sadly Ryan only played 16 games for City before a horrendous head injury curtailed his career. Like Gardner, Ryan won one England cap whilst at Spurs. Playing in March 2015 international against Italy.

Some players went better than the above and played more than once. Sam Weaver (213) signed for City in 1928 from Non-league Sutton Town for £50 and played in 50 games. He left City to play with distinction for Newcastle and Chelsea and played 3 times for England. In his third game, he played alongside another ex-Tiger, Ronnie Starling (202) who had joined City as a teenager and was employed as a clerk as he was too young to be a professional footballer. Ronnie played 86 times for City scoring 14 goals before being sold to Newcastle United. He played for England twice, both against Scotland at Hampden Park. Another player who began his career in Hull was Ernie Blenkinsop (136). Ernie joined from his village side Cudworth near Barnsley for £100 and a barrel of beer. A far cry from the thousands being paid for teenagers today. The young Ernie was up against Matt Bell and found it difficult to get a place in the first team. Eventually, he played 11 times and attracted a lot of attention but with City having financial problems he was sold to Sheffield Wednesday for £1500. He played 26

times for England between 1928 and 1933 and captained the side in 1931.

Vic Metcalfe (471) won 2 caps in 1951. He made 6 appearances for City, scoring 3 goals. Vic played his first game at the age of 36 against Plymouth on the first day of the 58/59 season and was injured and didn't play again until the first day of the 59/60 season, also against Plymouth. Don Revie (402) played 82 times for City, scoring 13 goals between November 1949 and October 1951. He then moved to Manchester City where he won 6 caps and scored 4 goals. Also, with 6 England caps and 3 goals is Jackie Sewell (478). Jackie played in the 2 infamous games against Hungary in 1953 and 1954. Jackie later moved to Zambia and funnily enough won 10 caps and scored 7 goals for the Africans. Jackie played 50 times for the Tigers scoring 9 goals between 1959 and 1961.

Jake Livermore (985) played 144 games for the Tigers and scored 9 goals between August 2013 and January 2017. Jake had represented England in 2012 whilst with Spurs and was not selected whilst at City, however on signing for WBA he played again for England against Brazil in 2017. He collected a total of 7 caps but why none when with City? Also signed from Spurs was Tom Huddlestone (984), a really classy player who had 4 caps before he came to Hull. Tom had 2 spells at City making 173 appearances and scoring 8 goals. Another signing from the north London club was Michael Dawson (996) who also had 4 caps gained whilst at Spurs. He was also a non-playing member of the 2010 World Cup squad.

Michael was also an excellent player making 132 appearances for City and scoring 9 goals.

A young player we had on loan in the 2017-18 season was Fikayo Tomori (1049). He came from Chelsea and represented the Tigers in 26 games. He is currently playing for AC Milan following a £24M transfer. He has represented England in 3 games, the last being earlier this year.

In more recent times we all remember Jarrod Bowen (1014) and the contribution he made to the Tigers. His impressive displays in 131 games and his 54 goals resulted in a £14m move to West Ham United. I doubt any of us are surprised with his progress and a subsequent call-up to the England team. To date, he has made 4 appearances with hopefully many more to come.

A further 13 players have played 10 or more games for England. There isn't space this month to go through them all, so we will return to this subject along with information on the 7 Managers who have played for England.

The players in question are Jack Hill, Raich Carter, Wilf Manion, Neil Franklin, Stan Mortenson, David Rocastle, Emlyn Hughes, Mark Hateley, Stuart Pearson, Nick Barmby, Ray Parlour, Danny Mills and Harry Maquire. There are some great players in the above and in a way Hull City fans have been privileged to have watched them play for the Tigers.

The following City managers represented England during their playing careers. Frank Buckley, Raich Carter, Cliff Britton, Wilf McGuiness, Brian Little, Peter Taylor and Mike Phelan.

#### **Evacuation Procedures**

Upon Hearing the Fire Alarm, please vacate the building in a calm and safe manner. If safe to do so the duty manager onsite will come and help vacate the room

# Where the emergency mustering area is

For the Dugout, the mustering area is located in the South Stand Car Park. Clearly sign posted. The car park is directly in front of the entrance door to the Dugout (please also see map below)

#### **First Aider onsite**

Your duty manager onsite that will introduce themselves at the beginning of the event to the main organizer is your first aider.

#### What to do in a medical emergency

Call 999 immediately. After calling emergency services, please contact your First Aider on 01482 358327 and a staff member will be with you straight away

#### Main point of contact in an emergency

Please call 01482 358327 which is a 24-hour manned line. This staff member will then report the emergency

#### Where is the de-fib and procedure to access

One de-fib is located near the changing rooms on the west stand and a staff member will get this if needed.

Second de-fib is located at the top of the stairs in the main reception, west stand for the general public to access
